This course will focus on intervention of feeding disorders using the **CAN-EAT Approach®**

CAN = Comfort and Nutrition (establish GI comfort and proper nutrition and growth first using medical and nutritional strategies. Address medical issues such as dysphagia.



EAT = Establish Acceptance of the spoon and easy textures, then **Therapy** for oral motor skill development and improving intake of volume and variety.



Learner outcomes:

- Participant will be able to explain the complex nature of feeding problems.
- Participants will recognize GI issues that interfere with successful feeding and learn how to work with the medical team.
- Participant will be able to prioritize intervention strategies resulting in improved oral feeding.
- Participant will be able to understand oral motor development and use techniques to achieve improved oral motor patterns.
- Participant will be able to use behavioral feeding strategies to improve acceptance of food or liquid.
